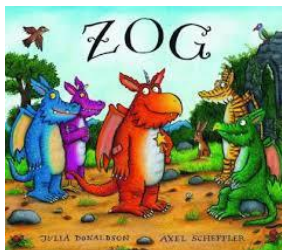


# RECEPTION HOME LEARNING

## Story telling



Julia Donaldson wrote our class book 'Superworm', so we thought we would look at another story by the same author, 'Zog'. This book is all about being at school and never giving up. We are all a little bit like 'Zog'!

Aim to read at least one story a day with your child. After you've read the same story a few times, ask them to re-tell the story to you!

## Zog Activities

- Write a list of school activities for Zog to do.
- Think about how Zog felt throughout the story.
  - Think about which part was the funniest.
  - Draw new ways Zog could have accidents.
- Draw a story map to retell the story to your adult.
  - Talk about the rhyming words you can hear.
  - Spot the phonemes you know in the story.
- Think about other animals that fly - Can you imagine a new animal that flies?

## Keeping active

Put on some music and dance together! You could listen to different types of music and see how you would move differently to slow, fast, loud, soft, happy or sad music. This is a great phonics activity too!

## Maths

We have been doing lots of sorting in school. Can you find ways to sort your toys? Maybe by colour or by what size they are. Remember that we can count them by putting them in a line and pointing to them one by one. Have a go at writing a line for each toy you count like the pizza menus we made. You might be able to write the number too.

Go on a shape hunt around your house. Can you spot a circle, square, rectangle or triangle? Have a go at drawing them and then talking about what they are like.

## Phase 1 phonics- Yellow Group

This time let's look at body percussion. How many different sounds can your body make?

Can you make them loud and quiet?

## Phase 1 phonics- Blue Group :

Let's have a look at Alliteration. Find objects that all begin with a, s and t around your house. Can you find 5 for each phoneme?

You could also play "I spy." You may want to introduce this game using names of people they can see. You can use photographs and say "I spy with my little eye, someone beginning with..." and sound out the initial sound of that person's name 😊

### Phase 2 phonics- Red Group :

You have worked really hard learning all the "S A T P I N" phonemes over the weeks. Now can you go on a letter hunt. See if you can find these letters and sounds around you. Hide some letters around the house or in the garden to find on your hunt. When each letter is found practice sounding it out.

Make sure you practise writing them too!
